What does Kvinna till Kvinna **do?**

Kvinna till Kvinna started in 1993 as a network of people and organisations coming together to do something in response to the atrocities being committed against women in the Balkan wars. Today, Kvinna till Kvinna cooperates with more than 130 women's organisations in five regions affected by conflict: Central and Western Africa, the Middle East, South Caucasus, and the Western Balkans. The foundation provides financial aid to local organisations and strengthens women's networks.

In 2002, Kvinna till Kvinna received the Right Livelihood Award for its successful support for women's peace and reconciliation work.

Kvinna till Kvinna's partner organisations possess invaluable and unique knowledge about women's situations in war and their efforts to build peace. Kvinna till Kvinna spreads information about women living in conflict zones and creates public awareness on development aid and security policy issues.

Why is there a need for Kvinna till Kvinna?

In wars and conflicts all over the world, women are used as targets. Women are raped, mutilated and killed. Women are confined to their homes and girls are prevented from attending school. Women's voices are silenced when they try to express what they think and feel.

But history shows that it is often women who are the first to work for peace and changes in society. This could be seen during the Balkan wars, in Liberia, and in the pro-democracy uprisings in the Middle East. Still, despite women's efforts, when the war ends women are seldom invited to participate in decisions about how to create a lasting peace.

This is why Kvinna till Kvinna exists. To help women to gain influence – in their families, at school, in the workplace and in politics. Kvinna till Kvinna supports and cooperates with women's organisations that struggle for women's rights and peace.

Free from violence

Violence against women increases during and after war. Many women remain severely traumatised after being abused. But with the right help they can move on. Kvinna till Kvinna's partner organisations run telephone hotlines and women's shelters, and offer psychological support. They work hard to change attitudes and to strengthen women's rights.
